
The Queen City is a City of Imports...

Neighborhood/Area Info

The greater Charlotte metro area encompasses many smaller towns/cities, 3 different lakes and even includes areas in South Carolina!

We call our downtown area <u>Uptown Charlotte</u>. In addition to being the main employment hub, Uptown Charlotte is now a popular move-to destination for young professionals with several new high-rises being built.

Moving south, the areas between 77 on the west and Independence Blvd (highway 74) are all considered to be <u>South Charlotte</u>.

Neighborhood/Area Info: *Popular Areas in South Charlotte*

<u>Dilworth/Myers Park</u> – Two of the original suburbs of Charlotte, Dilworth and Myers Park host some of the most expensive cost/sqft in the city. Tall trees? YES

<u>Southpark Area</u> – Directly south of Myers Park the Southpark area- it has become the heart of south Charlotte and is popular for its upscale shopping, restaurants and central location. It is also a major employment center.

<u>South Blvd Neighborhoods</u> - Including Madison Park, Colonial Village, Collins Park and Starmount the South Blvd neighborhoods have seen massive appreciation over the last 5 years as the light rail and all the of the economic development associated with the area. A favorite among young professionals and down sizing boomers alike!

<u>Matthews</u> – Located in southeast Charlotte the city of Matthews combines small town charm with proximity to all of those big city amenities. It's also one of the more affordable areas in south Charlotte today.

Neighborhood/Area Info: *Popular Areas in South Charlotte Cont*.

<u>Ballantyne area</u> – Broadly thought of as the 28277 zip code, the Ballantyne area is its own employment hub with several Fortune 500 companies located there. Along with top schools, popular restaurants and shopping the Ballantyne area remains one of the most desirable areas in Charlotte.

<u>Steele Creek</u> – Located in southwest Charlotte between 485 and the Catawaba river Steele Creek is a popular option for young families and first time home buyers. Proximity to 77, the airport and 485 are also a plus.

<u>Union County</u> – Encompassing much of Weddington and Waxhaw, close-in Union county is a popular choice for those who want a bit more land and lower taxes.

<u>Fort Mill</u> – Located just over the border in SC, Fort Mill is truly a suburb of Charlotte. It's about 20 minutes down 77 from Uptown Charlotte assuming your outside of rush hour. Fort Mill has been exploding over the last 5 years due to its proximity to town, low taxes and new home developments.

Neighborhood/Area Info: *Lake Life*

Lake Norman located to the north, is the largest freshwater lake in NC with over 1300 miles of shoreline!

<u>Mountain Island Lake</u> is to the west, waterski and fish on Charlotte's closest but smallest lake

Lake Wylie NC and SC is to the south, closer and smaller than Norman, it is the fastest growing region of Charlotte

Neighborhood/Area Info: *Lake Norman Towns*

<u>Huntersville</u> – The first town on Lake Norman north of Charlotte, Huntersville sports a well developed downtown with many popular neighborhoods off of Gilead Rd and exit 25. Your money goes much further in Huntersville than south Charlotte. Shop or dine at popular Birkdale. <u>Search Huntersville homes</u>

<u>Cornelius</u> – North of Huntersville you find Cornelius, home to some of the finest waterfront property in all of Charlotte. Still commutable to Uptown too! <u>Search Cornelius homes</u>

<u>Davidson</u> – Just north of Cornelius you'll find Davidson, home to Davidson College and the Wildcats. You might have heard of a famous alum named Steph Curry. <u>Search Davidson homes</u>

<u>Mooresville</u> – AKA Race City USA, Mooresville is at the top of Lake Norman and home to many NASCAR teams. I love the smell of rubber in the morning! <u>Search Mooresville homes</u>

Charlotte Area Schools:

About K – 12 Schools

Few parenting decisions loom larger for your child's future than finding the right school for your child or children.

We've tried to assemble the tools you'll need to help you find that fit. My wife and I have 4 children and they grew up here, all attended private primary (K-8) and public high school. All 4 have now graduated from college and two have completed masters programs. Your greater Charlotte area public school choices are:

<u>Charlotte-Mecklenburg Public Schools</u> – Commonly called CMS

<u>Union County Public Schools</u> – For cities like Waxhaw, Weddington, etc

Iredell County Public Schools – Covers several northern cities like Mooresville

Cabarrus County Public Schools – Concord, Harrisburg, generally NE Charlotte



Charlotte Area Schools South Carolina Schools

Many families relocating to Charlotte decide to live in South Carolina. Fort Mill and Indian Land are true suburbs of Charlotte even though they're across the border.

Expect lower taxes and quality schools (since they have to compete with Mecklenburg County), with a bit of a commute if you work in Uptown Charlotte. Your South Carolina public school choices are:

York County Public Schools

Fort Mill Public Schools

Rock Hill Public Schools

Clover Public Schools







Charlotte Area Schools: *Private Schools*

Charlotte has a wide range of well- regarded private schools. By far the "Big Three" are <u>Providence Day</u>, <u>Charlotte Latin</u> and <u>Charlotte Country Day</u>.

Charlotte Homes: Low Housing Prices

Most people relocating to Charlotte are pleasantly surprised by the city's relative affordability. Charlotte consistently ranks towards the top of the list of affordable cities.

If you are relocating from a city in the Northeast, Midwest or West Coast and are able to keep your "big city" salary then it's likely that you'll live like kings and queens in the Queen City!

We recently relocated a NYC doctor who took a 25% pay cut moving to Charlotte. He confided that the move was also a pay raise due to Charlotte's housing market and general affordability!








Charlotte Homes: Taxes

Charlotte is in the bottom 1/3 of taxes paid per resident in the US. Our property tax rate in the City of Charlotte, Mecklenburg County is currently **\$1.31 per hundred** of assessed value. Each listing has a Tax Value and Tax Location- Tax location yields the Rate, and Tax Value (TV)

For example, a home may be Listed with an Asking price of \$500,000 (4000 sf) but with a Tax Value of \$305,000. Since state statues require the re-assessment of every property, every 8 years, that means this was the quick appraisal up to 8 years prior. And your taxes, even if you pay 450K for this home will be based on \$1.3 x 3050 (305000/100), or \$3900 per year (under \$1.00 sf) until the next assessment.







Charlotte Homes: Insurance

If you are from Florida or any coastal area, you will appreciate our low property insurance rates. We do not have a lot of natural disasters- we are 3 hours from the South Carolina Coast, far enough west to avoid coastal hurricanes, we frequently get rain from gulf coast hurricanes.

A \$400,000 home can be insured from \$800-\$1,200 per year, with reasonable deductibles... I know, I know, if you are from Florida or the Gulf you can't believe it!

Your housing dollar, total cost of housing, is lower, and your home payment goes MUCH further here.
